

## Pantry Palooza participants waste no time starting the party at Skyloft to benefit Laguna Food Pantry

Pantry Palooza started at 5 p.m. on Friday night, and by 5:10, Skyloft was already packed and rocking to the Agave Bros. Friends, neighbors, and supporters of Laguna Food Pantry wasted no time kicking off an evening of good food, drinks, dancing, and camaraderie to celebrate and raise funds for the Laguna Food Pantry.

For more than 25 years, Laguna Food Pantry has been a safety net for anyone - seniors, underemployed or people out of work, disabled, students, individuals, and families - who need free, fresh, nutritious food. They collect and distribute 4,000 lbs. of food every weekday and serve 400+ families a week in South Orange County.

Food Pantry Executive Director Anne Belyea says, "The Pantry Palooza is typically a friend-raiser. This year, we changed things up a bit and asked for sponsors. Our community of supporters opened their hearts and their wallets donating nearly \$30,000 to help provide food to our neighbors in need. We are so grateful for the support!"

A board member for two years, Pat O'Brien explains, "The biggest challenge for us is that people don't know what we do, that we feed the working poor in the community and those who don't have money to make it to the end of the month. The end of the month is one of our busy times. We chart every day. We're feeding more people, but we also have more sponsors. We've taken off in the last two years. We have our first full time Executive Director, Anne Belyea. She has the touch. She is amazing and has the experience and warmth to carry the mission of the pantry."

Five years ago, a friend brought Pat to the Pantry to help out. "I couldn't step away once I saw it," she says. "A high percentage of the population we serve is children. Our new concern is seniors going without food. We're working with Susi Q to address that. Some of them need rides, some are housebound."
